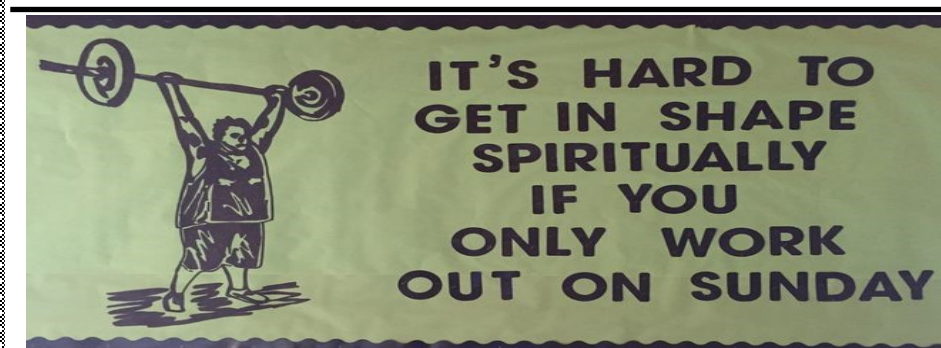

Proven Methods for Winning Hearts-by Tim Lewis/Gospel Advocate (II Samuel 15)
In the selfish attempt to over throw his fathers kingdom, Absalom did some very clever things; in fact, his plan was so effective that "he stole the hearts of the men of Israel" (II Samuel 15:6). What Absalom did was wicked, but the way he did it was wise, and we can learn several important lessons from his example if we look at what he did through the lens of Luke 16:8. There are three things Absalom did that every Christian can do. First, Absalom was strategically present. The Bible says, "He would get up early and standby the side of the road leading to the city gate." (II Samuel 15:2) Absalom positioned himself in a prominent place. In ancient times, the city gate was a place of public assembly. It was the forum of the city where affairs of the city were discussed and business was transacted. That's where Abraham met with Ephron the Hittite to negotiate a price for the field and cave where he eventually buried his wife, Sarah. (Genesis 23:10-18) That's where Boaz met with the kinsman redeemer to finalize the legal transaction that made it possible for him to marry Ruth (Ruth 4:1-5) and that's also where the respected leaders of the city would meet (Proverbs 31:23) to speak with their fellow townspeople. (Genesis 34:20). Absalom understood the importance of strategic presence. He went where he could have the greatest contact with people. The first lesson we learn from this man is that you can't have any meaningful impact on other people if you never interact with them. That's why Christians should attend ballgames, concerts and graduation ceremonies. We should be present at weddings and funerals. We should make every effort to visit hospitals, nursing homes, mental health facilities and other places where people gather to support one another, to celebrate, or to grieve. We should make the most of our weekly assemblies by stationing greeters at the main entrance to the church, by asking elders to stand by the doors to the auditorium, and training Bible class teachers to identify and welcome first time visitors. High traffic areas provide the best opportunity to meet and interact with guest. We should make sure that some of our most outgoing and welcoming people are strategically positioned in these places. Along with key locations, we should also be aware of the most crucial times to meet and welcome visitors. The best opportunities for positive interaction include (1) The time before class, (2) The time between class and worship and (3) The time right after worship. Something else Absalom did was he got up early. If you never attend classes or rarely come to worship, or if you are always habitually late then you are missing out on some of the best opportunities to make an impact on other people. Be honest. If we can get up early to hunt, fish, golf and shop, and if we can be on time for work, movies, ballgames and concerts, then we can get up early and be on time for Bible class and worship. Absalom was willing to do these things for evil purposes; we should be willing to do the same things to reach people with the saving gospel of Jesus Christ.
